## What to Expect When Becoming a Foster Parent

- First contact is made by an individual or family through website, phone, or in person event: <a href="https://strongerfamiliestogether.sd.gov">https://strongerfamiliestogether.sd.gov</a> or 855.830.5062
- Inquiry coordinator responds within 48 hours and provides overview of the process, gathers basic information from the family, and answers questions.
- After an informational packet is sent to the family, the inquiry coordinator sets up a second call with the family to confirm their interest in becoming licensed.
- A training specialist contacts the family to set up an initial home-visit to provide additional information and assist the family to decide if they will apply to become a foster parent.
- Family is enrolled in the training curriculum: 30 hours of online and inperson training is completed.
- Approximately 3-4 home visits occur to discuss strength's and needs regarding providing foster care.
- Background checks, reference checks, health assessments, and a homesafety inspection are completed.
- The assessment information is compiled into a Home Study.
- Licensure status is determined.
- Licensed families are assigned a DSS Licensing Specialist to assist with matching children with your family and to provide support.
